Dear colleagues,

The Organizing Committee of the **58th International Congress of Americanists** (ICA) warmly welcomes the worldwide academic community and extends a most cordial invitation for the participation in the 58th ICA edition to be held in Novi Sad, Serbia, **from 30 June to 4 July 2025.**

On behalf of the Organizing Committee of the 58th ICA, we would like to express our gratitude for your proposals for **symposia and round tables** and inform you that the call will be open until **September 15, 2024**. We also invite you to participate with **individual presentations**.

The motto of the 58th ICA "New challenges, New spaces" is intended as a prompt to reflect on contemporary reality on a global scale and to develop viable theoretical and practical proposals to face disturbing current challenges in all areas of our social existence. The 29 thematic areas of the Congress will allow us to analyze, from a multidisciplinary and pluralistic perspective, a wide range of topics,

phenomena and processes in social sciences, humanities and related disciplines.

The headquarters of the 58th ICA will be the University of Novi Sad (UNS), located on the bank of the Danube River in the central area of the city. The University campus is an architecturally compact area that allows for easy and quick internal transportation, less than a kilometer from the historical center of the city where most of the hotels, restaurants and cultural events in Novi Sad are located. The Nikola Tesla international airport in Belgrade is less than an hour away by highway that connects the two most important cities in the country. The airports of Timisoara (Rumania), Budapest (Hungary) and Vienna (Austria) are also not too far away.

It is of vital importance to us that, on this occasion, we can add a Balkan perspective to Americanism and, in this way, enrich the great variety of hermeneutical perspectives on the topics that will be discussed at the Congress.

STRUCTURE

Following the usual scheme and traditional format of our congresses, the organizational structure of the 58th ICA will consist of:

- ♦ Plenary sessions
- ♦ Keynote lectures in different thematic areas, including the opening and closing of the Congress
- ◊ Symposia
- ◊ Round tables
- Sessions with individual presentations
- ◊ Fringe events
- ♦ General Assembly

SIMPOSIA / ROUND TABLES / INDIVIDUAL PRESENTATIONS

- Symposia and round tables should have **two coordinators**, preferably from different countries. Symposium coordinators will be **exempt from registration** fees if the symposium they coordinate has a minimum of 10 registered participants.
- b) A researcher can, at most, coordinate one symposium and co-coordinate another.
- c) A participant may present, at most, **two papers in different symposia**, always choosing one of the ICA thematic areas.
- d) **A symposium can have a minimum of 7 registered papers and a round table of 5**. If a symposium has more than 20 approved papers, it will be divided into sessions.
- e) **Symposium proposals for the 58th ICA are accepted until September 15, 2024**, through the platform https://ica2025.uns.ac.rs.
- f) **Each of the Symposium or Round Table proposals must contain the following information**: name and surname of the coordinators, their email address, institution to which they belong, curriculum profile no longer than half a page, thematic area to which they wish to be assigned, title of the symposium/round table and summary with a maximum of 300 words with 5 keywords...
- g) Once the symposium has been approved, each member/participant who is interested in it must register individually, indicating the title of his/her symposium on the form. Approval of the symposium does not constitute a certificate. Certificates will only be issued for symposia held.
- h) Each **proposal for individual presentations** must contain the following information: name and surname(s) of the author, email address, institution to which he/she belongs, curriculum profile no longer than half a page, title of the presentation and abstract with a maximum of 250 words with 5 keywords. **The call for individual presentations opens on August 1 and closes on December 31, 2024.** The Organizing Committee will group the individual presentations into parallel sessions, according to their theme.
- Once their abstracts have been accepted, the participants will have a period of 90 days to pay their registration fee.

PARTICIPATION MODES: IN-PERSON AND VIRTUAL

The ICA2025 Congress symposia will have two participation modalities: in-person, between June 30 and July 3, and virtual (parallel sessions through the Microsoft Teams platform), on July 4, 2025.

If a symposium has some in-person participants and others online, it will be divided into two parts: one in-person and one virtual..

There will be no hybrid events, except for the opening of the Congress and the keynote lectures.

OFFICIAL LANGUAGES

The official languages of the Congress are: Spanish, English, French, German, Portuguese, Italian and Serbian.

The call for fringe events will be open from October 2024 to February 2025.

Publication of conference proceedings

The **digital publication of edited volumes** is envisaged, including the keynote speeches and the papers presented as part of the symposia, as approved by the coordinators of the thematic areas. The authors will be asked to send us signed authorizations. Each volume will have its respective ISBN/ISSN and individual papers will have the DOI.

Reception of papers to be incorporated into the Conference Proceedings: October 15, 2025.

REGISTRATION AND CONFERENCE FEE PAYMENTS

All participants must comply with the registration fee payment procedure, except for coordinators of symposia with 10 or more participants. The payments can be made from September 2024. **The forms and procedures will be notified in another circular.**

ICA JUNIOR - Bachelor's and Master's students

On this occasion, the 58th ICA will open the space for a significant participation of the youngest researchers interested in studies on the Americas. We consider it of utmost importance to involve the younger generations in our activities to strengthen global Americanism and, at the same time, promote intergenerational dialogue, stimulating research and intellectual production among young people. We intend for ICA-Junior to become an integral part of our Americanist community and for its presence at the Congresses to become a tradition. A new call for applications for ICA JUNIOR will be opened.

SCHOLARSHIPS

- ➤ Reduced registration fee (70 EUR) for symposia with 15-20 registered participants.
- **Reduced registration fee (30 EUR) for young researchers** (up to 30 years of age).
- > BUDDY Program: Accommodation for students and young researchers (up to 30 years old) from any country in the houses of Serbian students and young researchers.

In addition to the various hotel and hostel options, the city of Novi Sad has a wide range of private accommodations, including apartments and studios, available for rent through platforms such as Booking.com and Airbnb. Naturally, their prices vary depending on factors such as size, specific location and the level of services offered.

HOW TO GET TO NOVI SAD FROM BELGRADE

There are bus and train connections between Belgrade and Novi Sad. The bus timetable can be found here: http://www.bas.rs/. Several bus companies operate on this route, with one-way ticket prices ranging from 6 EUR (640 RSD) to 9 EUR (990 RSD). The train timetable is available here: https://srbijavoz.rs/. We recommend taking the SOKO high-speed train. The one-way ticket price is between 4 and 8 EUR (400 and 850 RSD). The ticket can be purchased online.

TRANSPORT SERVICE IN NOVI SAD

Bus

Novi Sad offers an excellent and very comfortable bus service. More information about bus lines and timetables: http://www.gspns.co.rs/?selected lang=en. A single ticket can be purchased directly from the bus driver for 100 RSD (0.8 EUR).

Taxi

Taxis are not too expensive (by Western standards), a ride usually costs between 400-700 RSD (3-6.5 EUR). It is useful to have the address written down, although many taxi drivers speak English. However, be wary of taxis that are not affiliated with one of the main companies (especially at the train station):

Currency

The official currency of Serbia is the Serbian dinar (RSD, 1 dinar = 100 para), indicated by the symbol "din" or RSD. The value of €1 is approximately equivalent to 118 dinars. Currency exchange services are available at the airport, banks and most hotels. Numerous licensed exchange offices throughout the city have convenient locations and offer generally competitive rates. Before exchanging currency, it is recommended to check the presence of official licenses displayed by the exchange office and compare the exchange rates offered. All exchange receipts should be retained for record-keeping purposes.

Shopping and restaurants

Most shops in Novi Sad are open from 08:00 to 22:00, Monday to Saturday. Shops in the city centre are usually open from 09:00 to 22:00, Monday to Sunday.

Novi Sad has an impressive number of restaurants of all kinds (local, international, Mediterranean, vegan, vegetarian, oriental), bakeries and confectioneries. Prices differ depending on the type of food (5-20 euros per person).


